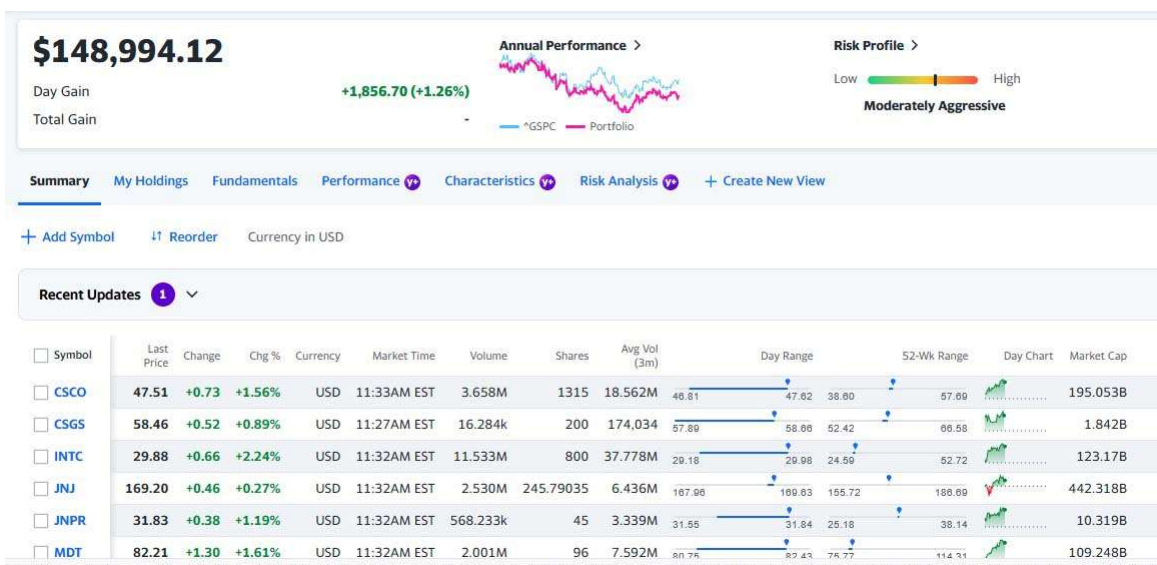
They need a separate computer or device

- Don't let them use your primary computer
- They could infect it with a virus
- They could compromise your passwords

Keeping them (and their money) safe

- Prevent access to online banking and stock trades
- Keep a list of their passwords and usernames
 - Including login for computer
 - Include smartphone unlock codes (or set to not use unlock codes)
- Enable parental control on browsing
- Prevent installation of software
- Check for viruses weekly
- Monitor emails, and make sure the mailbox doesn't fill up
