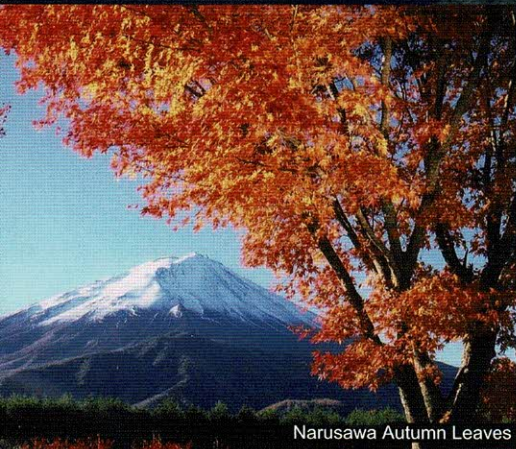

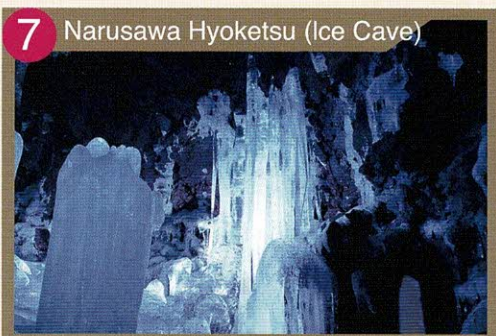
1 Mt. Fuji Panorama Ropeway
 ■ 富士山パノラマロープウェイ
 Departing from Kawaguchiko, this ropeway will take you to the observatory deck at the altitude of 1,100 meters, in 3 min, where you will enjoy the beautiful view of the Mount Fuji as well as the grand southern Alps.



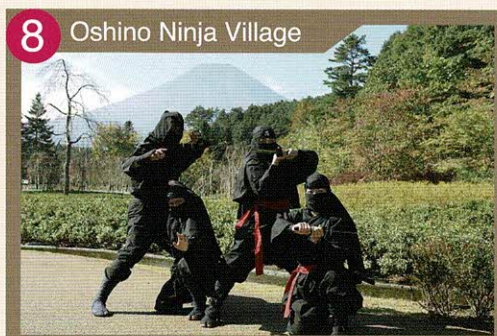
2 Amphibious Bus "YAMANAKAKO NO KABA"
 ■ 山中湖水陸両用 KABA バス
 This unique bus called "The Hippo of Yamanakako" will drive and cruise around the lake. Discover and enjoy Mt. Fuji's hidden treasures and wonderful views! (while participating in fun quiz sessions on board.)



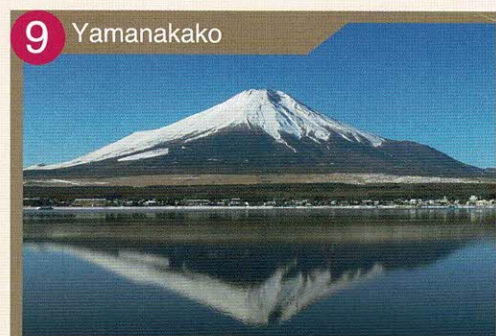
3 Oshino Hakkai
 ■ 忍野八海
 Registered as World Heritage, Oshino Hakkai (忍野八海) is a touristy set of eight ponds in the Oshino village, each pond enshrining a dragon to worship the Pilgrimage area related to the Fuji faith. You will find many shops and restaurants around the ponds which sell local food and crafts.



7 Narusawa Hyoketsu (Ice Cave)
 ■ 鳴沢氷穴
 A pit type cave, rich in natural undulations among other caves in the Aokigahara Jukai forest. Located at the base of Mt. Fuji, it provides a world full of adventure and secrets. Enjoy the amazing ice walls and pillars inside the cave throughout the year. It may feel warmer inside the cave during winter if there is no wind.



8 Oshino Ninja Village
 ■ 忍野しのびの里
 A park themed after one of the most interesting cultural features of mystical Japan: Ninjas. You can train to fight like a ninja by throwing Shurikens (throwing stars), enjoy ninja fighting shows and find your way out of the ninja trick house by squeezing yourself through hidden doors and traps.



9 Yamanakako
 ■ 山中湖
 Largest of the Fuji Five Lakes, Yamanakako is a popular recreational site. In good weather, you can see a perfect reflection of Mt. Fuji on the lake. From November to February, enjoy the beautiful phenomenon called "Diamond Fuji", in which the sun aligns with the peak of Mt. Fuji at sunrise and sunset, causing Mt. Fuji to shine bright like a diamond.

Getting around with the bus

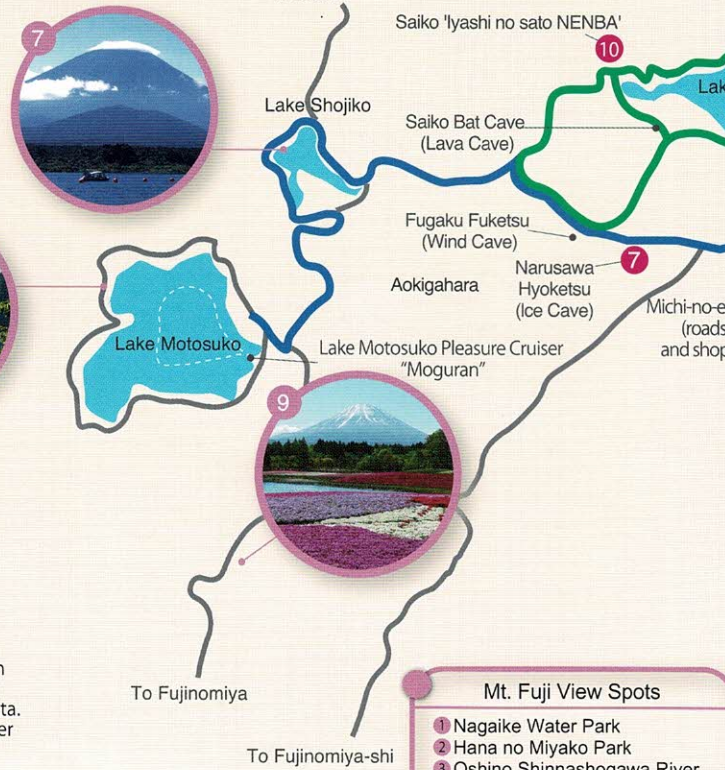
You can buy a special bus ticket which is available in Fuji Five Lakes area for two days. Make sure to buy the ticket for your destination and to check the timetables on the website. There are only few buses per hour. Furthermore, it would be hard to tell the special buses and regular ones because the regular ones additionally run when crowded. Tell the bus driver your destination. This map would be helpful for that

- ① Lake Kawaguchiko Sightseeing Bus** —
 1500 yen : Unlimited ride for 2 days in Kawaguchiko, Saiko and Motosuko areas
 From Kawaguchiko Sta. to Kawaguchiko Natural Living Center
 About 4 buses in an hour
- ② Lake Saiko Sightseeing Bus** —
 1500 yen : Unlimited ride for 2 days in Kawaguchiko, Saiko and Motosuko areas
 From Kawaguchiko Sta. to Lake Saiko
 About 2 bus in an hour
- ③ Lake Narusawa, Shojiko, and Motosuko Sightseeing Bus** —
 1500 yen : Unlimited ride for 2 days in Kawaguchiko, Saiko and Motosuko areas
 From Kawaguchiko Sta. to Lake Shojinko to Lake Motosuko
 About 1 bus in two hours

⑤ World Heritage Loop Bus —
 Unlimited Rides 2 day pass: 1030 yen/
 Kawaguchi-ko Station - Oshino Hakkai/
 Circulates every 1.5 hours

⑥ Fujisan Hiking Bus —
 One Way : Adult 1540 yen, Children 770 yen
 Round : Adult 2200 yen, Children 1100 yen
 Kawaguchiko Sta. to Oniwa to Fujisan 5th Sta.
 Only from early April to the end of November

Fujisan Fujigoko Passport
 You can get the ticket for unlimited ride for 2 days in ①~⑤ areas
 Adult 2,550 yen /Children 1,280 yen
 You can buy at Mt.Fuji Sta.,Kawaguchiko Sta. and Asahigaoka Bus terminal

10 treasures of Mt. Fuji Five Lakes Area & great view points



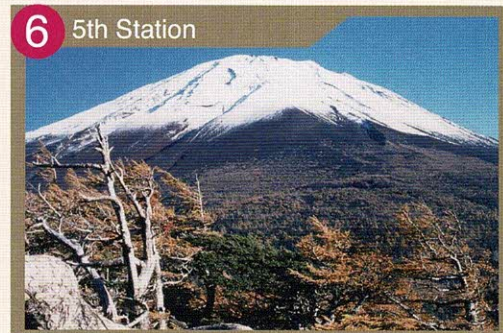
■ 新倉山浅間公園 忠霊塔

Get ready to climb 398 stairs, it is definitely worth it! Enjoy one of the best views of the five-storied pagoda and Mt. Fuji. The place is complimented with beautiful cherry blossoms in spring and amazing colors in autumn. This place is in walking distance from Shimoyoshida station (30min).



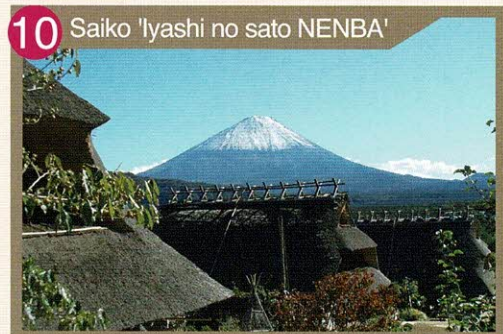
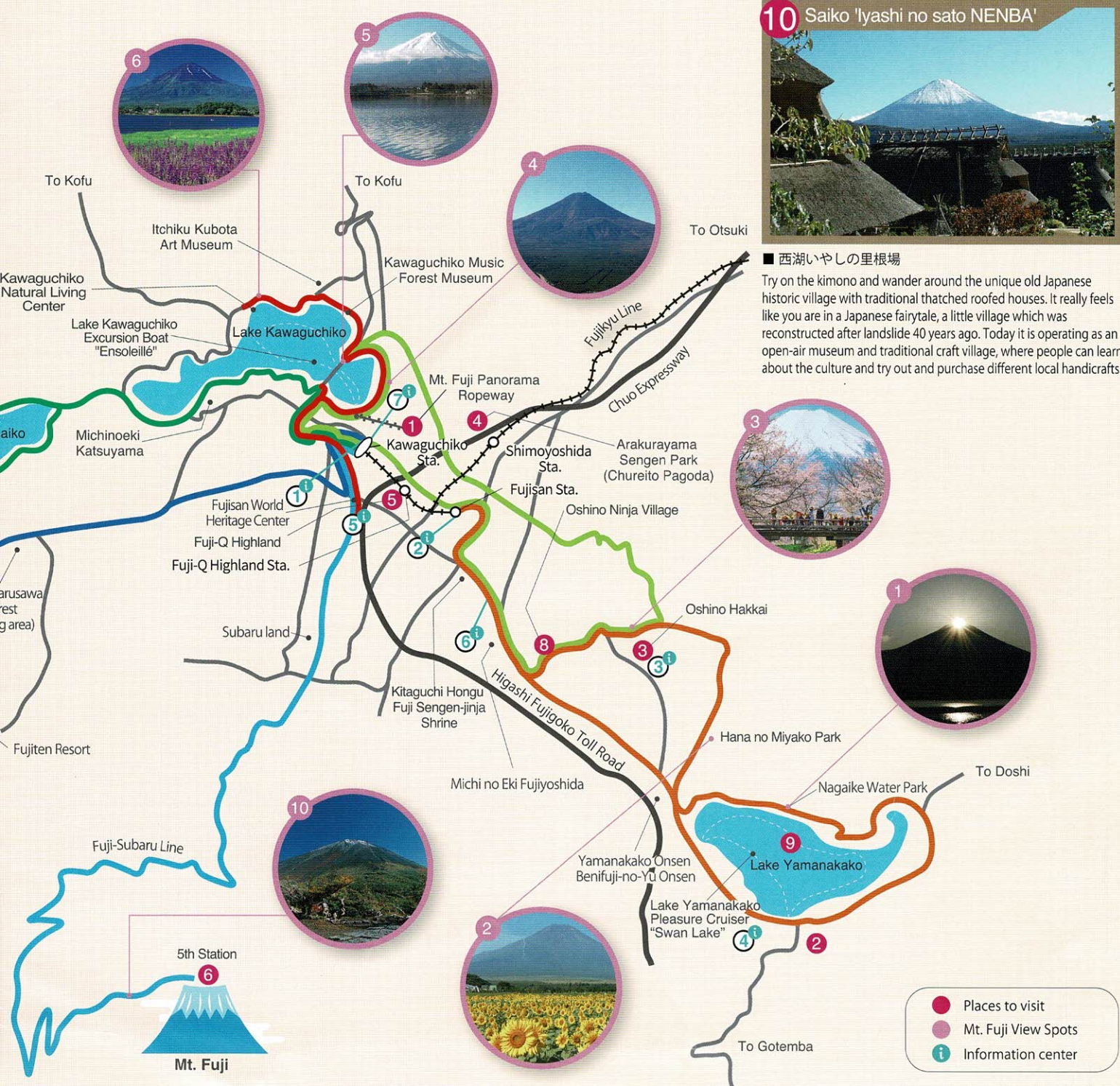
■ 富士急ハイランド

Come enjoy a full day of fun attractions with the thrilling, record-breaking roller coasters and world longest haunted house. Ice skating rink in winter offers double-blade skates for the beginners. Free admission since summer 2018. (admission for each ride applies)



■ 富士山五合目

Located 2300m above sea level, the 5th station of Mt. Fuji is reachable by bus from Kawaguchiko. Along with the Odake shrine of Fuji faith, there are also various restaurants and shops. Many start hiking up to the top of Mt. Fuji from this point in summer.



■ 西湖いやしの里根場

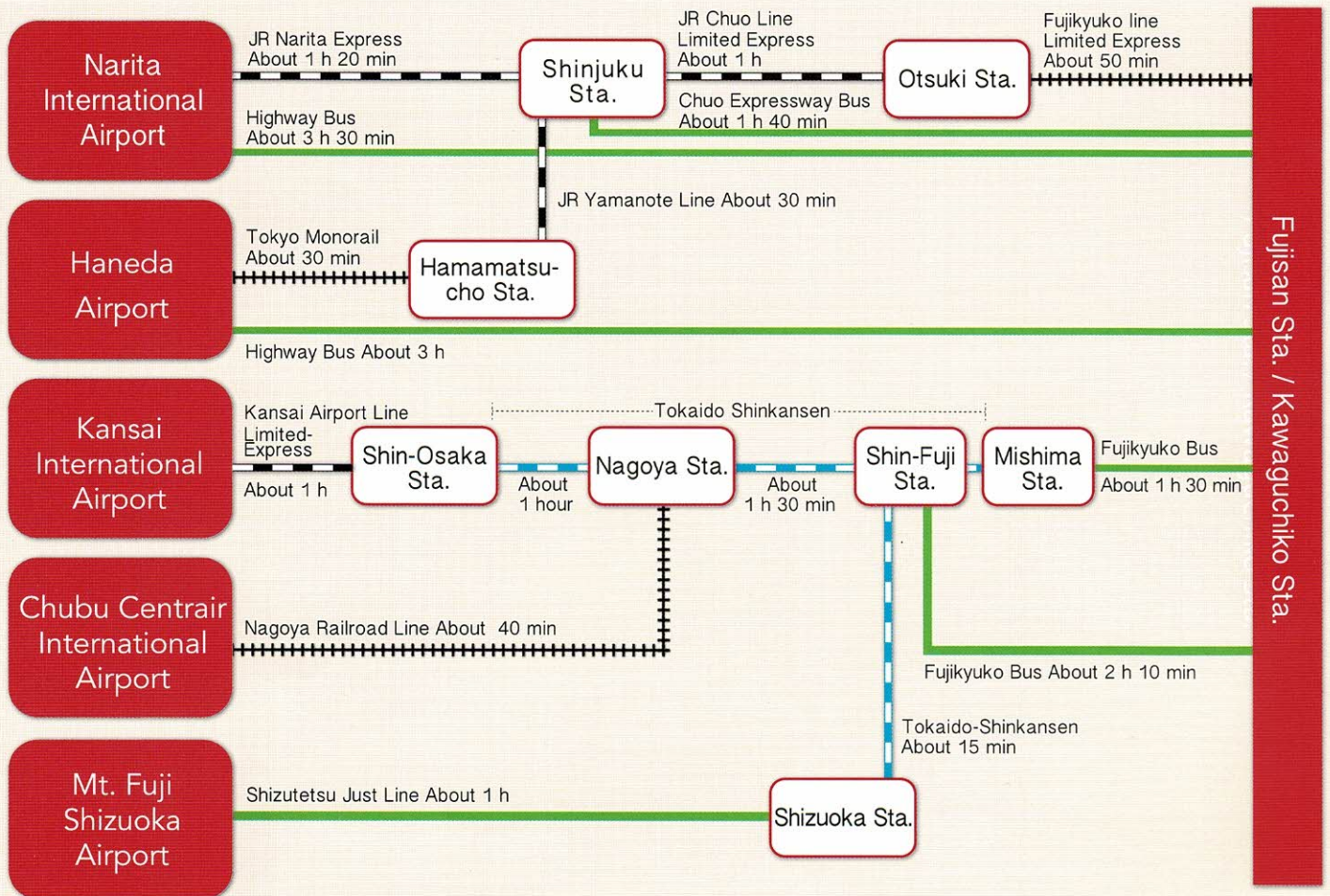
Try on the kimono and wander around the unique old Japanese historic village with traditional thatched roofed houses. It really feels like you are in a Japanese fairytale, a little village which was reconstructed after landslide 40 years ago. Today it is operating as an open-air museum and traditional craft village, where people can learn about the culture and try out and purchase different local handicrafts.
