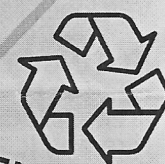
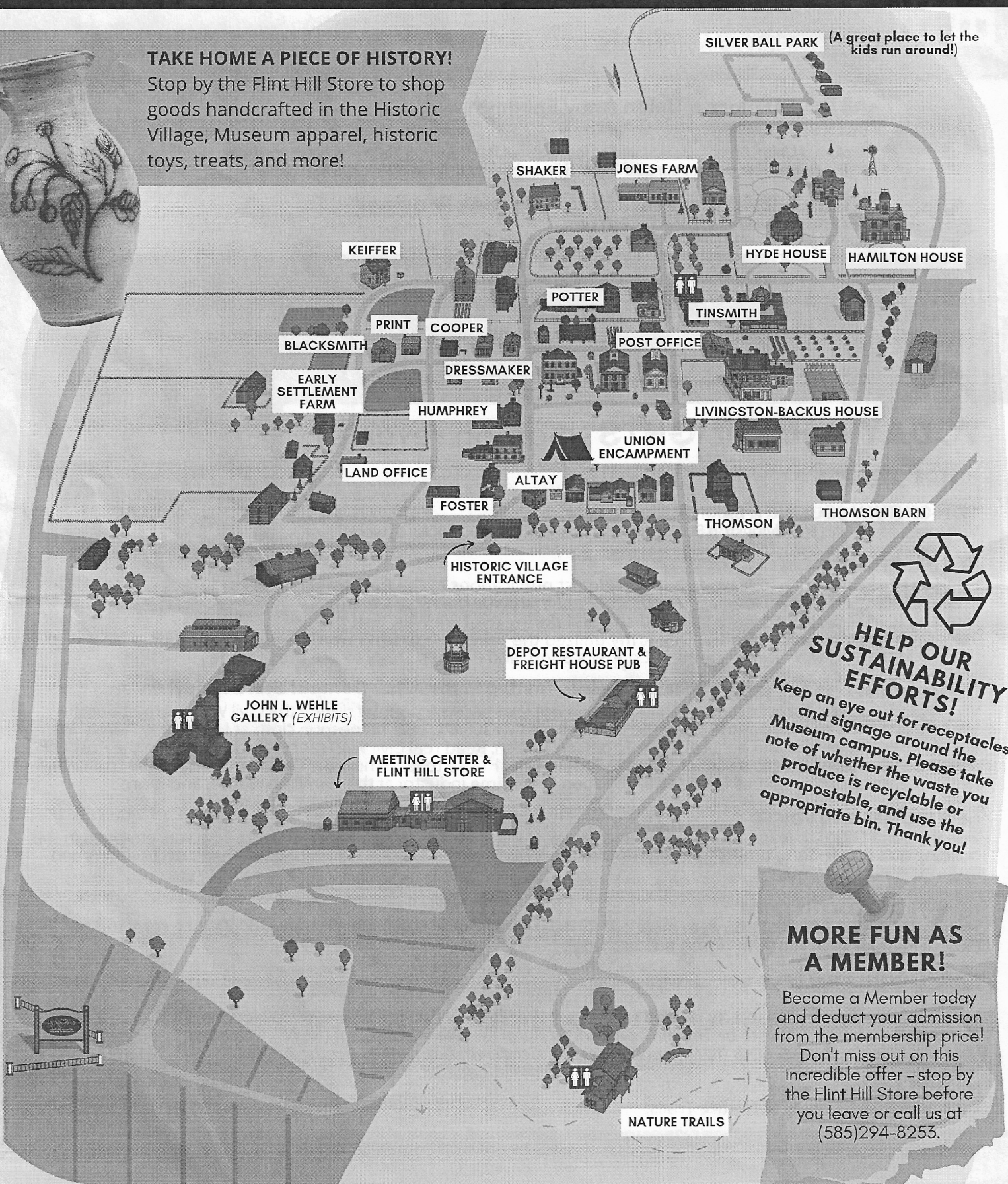

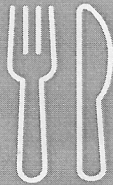

HISTORIC VILLAGE

19TH-CENTURY COOKING & BAKING

Visit Jones Farm and the Livingston Backus House to see costumed cooks at work!

HISTORIC TRADES

Head to the Print Office to learn about abolitionist publications in the Rochester area, including Frederick Douglass' *North Star Paper*. Browse the Altay General store and learn how goods were sold and shipped during the Civil War. Visit the Telegraph Office to learn how the U.S. Army utilized the telegraph to send wartime communications. Plus, stop by the Blacksmith's Shop, Brewery, Tailor, Cooper's Shop, and Potter's Shop, to see these trades in action!

LIFE AND TIMES OF THE 1860s



Chocolate tasting in the Altay General Store today!

Visit Hyde House to discover the Spiritualist movement that became popular during the Civil War, learn about the Shakers and their pacifist opposition to the Civil War, see weavers create homespun cloth at Humphrey House, learn about American politics and political life in Thomson Tavern. Read real Civil War-era correspondence in the Post Office, and write your own letter to a soldier. Head to Foster-Tufts House to learn how the Civil War changed the "culture of death." Learn about a regional family's participation in wartime industry at the Hamilton House, and more.

NEW STORIES AND VOICES

Visit the Land Office to learn about the life and legacy of Black Rochesterian Austin Steward, who was enslaved in this building and helped ferry others to freedom. Visit the Dressmaker's Shop to learn about women's occupations and fashions during wartime.

HOMEFRONT ON THE FARM

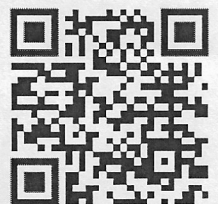
